MORE FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Our Student Services team are always on hand to give information and advice on financial issues. There are a range of financial support options that might be available to you, which vary depending on the level you're studying at and your circumstances. These include scholarships, bursaries, grants and loans. Visit our website and head to the finance section under the relevant level - college or university - for full details.

College Level: Course Costs

If you are 18 or under when you start your course, you won't have to pay any tuition fees. If you are 19 or over, you may still be able to study for free, based upon your age, previous qualifications, employment status and income. Your personal circumstances will need to be assessed to confirm whether a fee applies but, even if it does, you will be able to apply for an Advanced Learner Loan which you may never have to pay back.

Depending on your course, there may be equipment and clothing that's required. During our Open Events, our academic team will run you through everything that's needed for the course you're interested in.

In addition, all full-time further education students have to pay an annual £70 campus fee, which is non-refundable. This contributes towards enrichment activities, such as the costs of some trips and visits.

Degree Level: Planning Your Finances

Budgeting for life at university can be tricky when you've never had to do it before. Having your finances in order or a budget plan of what you will need before you start is one less thing you'll have to worry about.

Tuition fees for students studying a fulltime degree at Riseholme College in the academic year from September 2021 – May 2022 will be £9,250 a year. Fees for part-time students are calculated on a pro rata basis. Annual course fees will remain the same for the duration of your study programme.

There will be additional costs for some courses, such as trips and specialist equipment and clothing.

On successful completion of the programme, students have the opportunity to graduate at a ceremony wearing formal dress. The hire of the formal dress is an additional cost.

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MORE COURSES

Here at Riseholme College, our courses have been specifically designed to prepare our students for industry. You'll develop the practical skills and knowledge that you need to either go straight into work or to progress to higher level study.

We offer a range of course levels, from entry level to bachelor's degrees. We know that understanding the different levels can be confusing, which is why we've listed them for you to understand the differences.

ENTRY LEVEL:

These are pre-GCSE level and are ideal for those who didn't get the grades they hoped for at school and want to improve their education.

LEVEL 1:

A step up from Entry Level. These one-year courses are the equivalent of GCSE grade 3 or D to E.

LEVEL 2:

Level 2 courses are the equivalent of GCSE grades 4 or A* to C.

LEVEL 3:

These are equivalent to A-Levels and can be studied over one or two years. They can be taken as Foundation Diplomas, Extended Certificates, Diplomas or Extended Diplomas. We can help you decide which is the right path for you.

ACCESS TO HIGHER EDUCATION:

These Level 3 courses are designed for people aged 19 or over who want to return to education and prepare students to study at degree-level.

HIGHER NATIONAL CERTIFICATE (HNC):

When studied full-time, these are oneyear programmes. They are equivalent to the first year of a bachelor's degree (Level 4) and can also lead to a Higher National Diploma (HND).

FOUNDATION DEGREES:

These two-year degree programmes allow graduates to progress onto further study to achieve a BA or BSc degree. They are flexible, technical and employment related degrees that incorporate workbased study.

BACHELOR'S DEGREE:

A traditional three-year degree available here at Riseholme is a Bachelor of Science (BSc). Where you see (Hons) you will graduate with honours, provided you meet the required academic standard needed.

APPRENTICESHIPS

As well as our vocational full-time courses, we offer a range of apprenticeships in various subject areas, from Business to Horticulture. Like our full-time courses, we offer apprenticeships at different levels too. You can explore the full range at **www.riseholme.ac.uk/courses.**

Students are required to have appropriate employment with a business to undertake an apprenticeship. You may wish to source an apprenticeship with a local company and then apply via our application form to express an interest in studying with us to complete it. 

HOW To Apply

THE APPLICATION PROCESS

Here's what happens once we have received your application:

01 INTERVIEW

Once we've received your application you may be sent details of an interview date and time with the relevant course manager via email. We interview all college level students and our degree level course managers like to speak to some applicants too. Please let us know if the appointment you receive isn't suitable, we're here to fit around what's best for you.

02YOUR OFFER

Once our team are happy, you'll receive an offer of a place at Riseholme with details of any conditions you'll need to secure your place, i.e. necessary qualifications. Please confirm whether you accept the offer or not. If during the interview you realise the course isn't for you, don't worry, we're here to help guide you to the route that is right for you.

LINCS2

If your school is subscribed to Lincs2, an online prospectus and application system that lists the courses available from lots of different colleges within the Lincolnshire area, you may apply for college level courses using the system. If you do apply using Lincs2, you don't need to apply via our website too. We'll process your application just as we would if you apply via our website.

03 WHAT NEXT

If you're planning on living on campus, you'll be sent details via email when applications open. We advise that you apply asap as rooms are allocated on a first-come-first-served basis.

04 ENROLMENT

During the summer before you start here at Riseholme College, you'll be sent full details of how to enrol with us and a reminder of what you will need for your course and how to purchase those items. Don't worry if you don't meet all of the entry requirements for your course, we will do our best to offer you an alternative course to keep you on track.

WHEN TO APPLY

Applications for the year you wish to study open in September the year before. We recommend that you apply as soon as you can to secure your place, but we accept applications right the way through to the September you wish to start with us, provided we have spaces available and the course remains open. Whilst UCAS advertise a January deadline, this is the case for college and degree level programmes.

HOW TO APPLY

All full-time degree applications should be made via the Universities and Colleges Admissions Service (UCAS) website - www.ucas.com. You will need to use University Centre Bishop Burton's institution code, which is **B37**, choosing campus code R for Riseholme.

Applications for all full-time college level courses and part-time university level programmes can be submitted directly through the Riseholme website at **www. riseholme.ac.uk/applynow.**

f MORE LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES

We use a range of teaching methods to make sure that you have built the skills you need to succeed in your chosen industry by the time that you complete your course with us.

Our experienced, supportive and motivated staff have both academic and industrial experience. A range of guest speakers will further supplement your learning and ensure that you're fully prepared to start your career.

For all modules, theory-based lectures are where you will receive the core content of your programme and where the essential, underpinning knowledge will be delivered.

To cement the learning from theory-based lectures, you will also take part in group seminars and tutorials. Finally, the allimportant, hands-on practical sessions will reinforce concepts and develop the skills that support the theory.

We encourage students to take part in extra-curricular activities and/or work experience, which is essential for some of our courses, to enhance your learning.

As a Riseholme College student, you will also have access to an online Virtual Learning Environment (VLE), which will enhance and facilitate teaching and independent learning on all programmes.
