2.	Actions from last meeting	
2.1	JD called for new updates including events/outreach offerings for service children to promote on https://www.thefuturefocus.co.uk/	ALL
2.1.1	JD called for new ideas for SCiP Alliance projects (including for Month of the Military Child) to be brought to the next meeting or directly to JD.	ALL
2.1.2	AP mentioned Rolls Royce STEM activities being delivered in schools. AP to share contact with JD and wider group.	АР
3.	Member's Development Updates	
3.1	The chair opened discussion for any updates - no formal updates.	
4.	Future Focus in STEM	
4.1	JD provided and update. All dates have been confirmed for the 6th-10th March. The day will spread over four days, primary schools will have one day, secondary schools two days and one day for colleges.	
4.1.1	One of the days will have an evening session for parent/carers to attend. It will be an opportunity to ask questions regarding careers, employability and education.	
4.1.2	The venue has now been moved to Waddington venue which has a capacity of 350 students.	
4.1.3	JD called for members to offer up suggestions for potential stall holders.	
4.1.4	KB proposed from a primary angle the Children's University is a free group for primary and secondary schools that offer learning activities. The platform offers the chance for students to earn credits over the academic year. 30 credits mean they can attend a graduation at the end of the year. The Future Focus in STEM event could offer an opportunity to allow students to gain credits by attending the event.	
4.1.5	JD, KB and LT will meet outside the meeting to discuss the Children's University and the opportunities available	JD,KB,LT
5.	Post-16 Research-to-Practice Project	
5.1	JD will be attending a conference in Oct to see the research launch. Upon receipt of the report, JD will distribute across the group.	JD
5.1.1	GB noted Boston college had tried to support the research, but data was presenting an issue. Since then, the college has changed their enrolment form to capture more data.	
6.	Military Personnel Taster Days at HEI's	
6.1	NE noted a meeting took place with Gemma Gazi about a possible FE and HE event at BGU and UoL for Military Personnel. This would include subject taster sessions, campus tours, student finance etc. Both will offer different aspects to offer an insight into university life. Since both universities are within walking distance, the individuals will swap over halfway through.	
6.1.1	The opportunity could be opened to secondary school and college students. Other organisations such as FE colleges and RAF/ARMY outreach teams will be invited to	

hold a stall to share careers, employability and application information.

	health and wellbeing, teaching, hair and beauty. This is for spouses and military	
	personnel to engage with.	
7.1.1	JD noted LiNCHigher would be happy to distribute any information to bases to support.	
7.1.2	KB noted there is little for families on additional learning, specifically for spouses.	
7	Most help available is online due to limited outreach.	
7.1.3	VP mentioned the Military Co-working Network which aims to enable all military	
	spouses and partners to create independent, professional lives alongside military life.	
7.1.4	It is aimed to reach isolated individuals.	
7.2	JD noted the creation of subgroups to work on smaller projects within the Lincolnshire	
	and East Midlands hub network.	
7.2.1	JD noted it was necessary to understand what the local context is on bases and local	
	communities to understand what the group could offer to fill identified gaps.	
7.2.2	KB noted she was happy to take on a subgroup to map provision. KB would send an	KB
	email out to anyone who may be keen to join the mapping provision subgroup.	
7.2.3	JD noted if there was any interest for any other subgroups, this can be looked at.	
7.2.4	JD called for any assistance/ individuals to support with the Future Focus in STEM	
	event to ensure continuation year on year once LiNCHigher ceases.
